
Methodological work on developing a minimum set of indicators: violence against children, children in alternative care, children with disabilities

Facilitate and support the work on international classifications and indicators as follows:

- Collect and exchange good practices for producing statistics on violence against children
- Support the development of the International Classification of Children in Alternative Care
- Exchange experience on child-related surveys to improve their international comparability & pertinence to the internationally agreed indicators and classifications.

Data collection package and schedule

Package should contain documents

- Definitions and <u>quidelines</u>
- Template (includes data from previous years)
- Technical instructions how to fill the template
- Observations and data availability

Suggestions to recheck before submission


- ✓ **Re-check** the data compiled with the published data of line ministries
- ✓ 100% coverage of all agencies by region
- ✓ Indicate flags list (Provisional, Estimate, Partial, Different Definition, Break in Series)
- ✓ Include data source, recheck footnote for dissemination
- ✓ Prioritize **single age** over age group
- ✓ Fill "qualitative information" worksheet in the template
- Small team to review the data availability, definition and double counting



Alternative care data improvement planning initiative

- KAZ developed plan in 2023 (under review by Government)
- TJK integrating actions into D4C
 Roadmap and making the link to the broader CP system reforms and efforts to strengthen CPIMS
- TKM developing plan in 2024 and making the link to the broader CP system reforms

Other country efforts linked to TransMonEE are underway within the European Child Guarantee, national child rights monitoring, the humanitarian and refugee responses



Key lessons learned in 2023

Critical intersector process > start integration

Ensure local level engagement > tackle 'root causes'

Adjustment of global toolkit required

Improvements in data and data systems > governance too

Integrate with broader CP, CPIMS, e-government reforms

Combine selfassessment with field monitoring

Clarify definitions used across Government






How likely is it that one or both will experience violence in their. childhood and that this will be officially reported?

2024 TransMonEE analytical series: development process

Preparatory phase

Mapping of indicators and data sources in the region

Recruitment of regional consultant

Implementation phase

Data analysis, contextualisation, synthesis and visualization incl. data gap analysis (ICVAC)

Data validation with national stakeholders

Dissemination phase

Main products: analytical report incl. good practices, landing page, policy brief, presentation

Child poverty and material deprivation

Concerns the opportunities for children to enjoy an adequate standard of living which ensures their physical, mental, spiritual, moral and social development. It assesses the effectiveness of the material assistance and support programmes aimed at reducing poverty and inequality, particularly with regard to nutrition, clothing and housing.


CRM Framework Development Roadmap

Implement Feedback Feature: Add a direct feedback mechanism at the sub-domain level within the CRM Framework portal.

Conduct Collaborative Workshops: Arrange online sessions with countries actively using the indicators to share experiences and insights, fostering a learning environment.

Ongoing Refinement Based on Feedback:

Continuously improve the framework by integrating feedback collected through the portal and discussion outcomes.
