

OVERVIEW OF THE FRAMEWORK

THE CONTEXT

The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) is the leading international treaty on the rights of the child, ratified by almost all members of the United Nations. Its provisions are detailed and comprehensive and cover many areas of children's lives from family and health care to education and leisure, with provisions for particularly vulnerable children, like those without parental care, children in situations of migration and children in contact with the law. In light of the indivisible and inter-dependent nature of its provisions, States Parties are required to implement the UNCRC as a whole, thus, ensuring the realization of all rights guaranteed under the treaty for all children in their jurisdiction.¹

Child rights monitoring (CRM) may be described as "a broader effort to systematically evaluate the extent to which all the rights of all children are effectively protected and fulfilled." Ensuring that the monitoring process addresses all the rights contained in the UNCRC and not only a specific groups of rights, is of key importance. CRM requires a proactive approach in collecting data, ensuring its accuracy, reporting and use to further child rights. It has several important purposes, including identification of the rights that are not adequately protected or enjoyed, and the groups of children that may be particularly disadvantaged, evaluation of the relevance and effectiveness of the measures that are in place to promote the safeguard child rights and fostering informed social debate on public policies concerning child rights.

In the national and international contexts, there have been a number of initiatives for applying various frameworks and tools for monitoring child rights, undertaken by diverse stakeholders. These developments have been crucial in understanding child rights related issues and supporting better public policy response and programme development. Nevertheless, the existing practices have often been limited in breadth and scope, as there are aspects

of the UNCRC that are not sufficiently covered, while direct data and indicator linkages to the UNCRC provisions and the broader 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development are frequently lacking.

THE CONCEPT

Building on past developments, since 2020, UNICEF ECARO started to work on a tool to analyze, summarize and present key child rights issues, bottlenecks and strategies. This tool, named the Europe and Central Asia Child Rights Monitoring Framework (ECA CRM framework), has its conceptual roots in the UNCRC, It striving to promote a holistic and coherent approach to monitoring child rights. It has evolved into a broader CRM framework for analyzing the situation of children as well as all other analytical and data initiatives in the ECA region and beyond.

The framework covers six critical child rights domains, which are further broken down to specific sub-domains, as well as six cross-cutting dimensions which should be mainstreamed across the domains. Sets of statistical and other types of indicators have been mapped against each sub-domain and will be further refined on the basis of multiple rounds of consultations with all the concerned stakeholders. While existing measures and indicators, including child-related Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) indicators, are favored, the framework will also include newly developed/developing indicators as well as highlight those child rights and areas that have measurement or data availability gaps.


Aiming to facilitate governmental and independent stakeholders' efforts in monitoring the UNCRC implementation, the domains, sub-domains and cross-cutting dimensions in the framework are coupled with the corresponding provisions of the UNCRC. Acknowledging the interlinked nature of the rights of the child and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, the framework also highlights the SDGs and targets which are relevant to protecting and promoting children's rights.

SUB-DOMAIN DESCRIPTION

Child rights governance covers multiple aspects related to the legislative, administrative, and other measures governments are required to undertake for the implementation of child rights. These include:

- measures for reviewing and bringing domestic legislation, policy and practice into full conformity with the UNCRC;
- adopting and implementing a unifying, comprehensive and rights-based national strategy for children;
- establishing cross-sectoral governmental structures for coordination and monitoring of child rights;
- developing training and capacity-building for all those for all those working with and for children;
- measures for making the principles and provisions of the UNCRC widely known to adults and children; and
- cooperating with civil society, including non-governmental organizations, child- and youthled organizations and youth groups, parent and family groups, faith groups, academic institutions and professional associations.

SUB-DOMAIN 1.7.: RIGHT TO REMEDY



SUB-DOMAIN DESCRIPTION Right to remedy refers to the general ability of children to obtain a remedy when their rights are being violated, not respected or denied. This can apply to children who are unable to access services like education, health care or social welfare to which they are entitled and children who are directly or indirectly part of legal or administrative proceedings that affect them. It entails aspects related to access to child-sensitive redress mechanisms, including before independent national human rights institutions.

The rights to remedy of children accused of committing a crime and children who are a victim of or witnesses to a crime is addressed within other domains of the framework.
