Improving the Quality of Data and setting standards

- Improved templates and data quality/validation.
- Work with the Conference of European Statisticians to improve the standards and engage other countries.
- Support a group of countries with more focused data improvement planning.

Strengthen the TransMonEE Network


- Increased engagement with NSOs (and NSS) during the year, leveraging collaboration between countries and exchange on best practices.




TransMonEE database: indicators by source

Harvest available data from the **international databases**. Keep **data collection from the partners** to the most strategic and minimal indicators.




TransMonEE database: Indicators by disaggregation

Domestic general government health expenditure (% of general government expenditure)


Domestic general government health expenditure per capita, PPP (current international \$)

Percentage of infants under 6 months of age who are exclusively breastfed


2.2.2. Percentage of children under age 5 who are above two standard deviations (moderate and severe) of the median weight for height of the WHO standard - Overweight prevelance


