What is DevInfo?

- Software for organizing and use of socio-economic indicators from multiple sources. It offers the data visualization in the form of tables, graphs, maps and profiles.
- It was developed and supported by the UNICEF and <u>is free to use</u>.
- It has been used in the Republic of Serbia since 2003 ChildInfo.





Main sources for child data

- Statistical Office of the Republic of Serbia (MICS, Vital Statistics, Education etc.)
- Ministry of Labour, Employment, Veteran and Social Affairs (Information system, <u>administrative data</u>)
- Institute of Public Health of Serbia (Epidemiology)
- Republic Institute for Social Protection (Annual Reports of the Centers for Social Work)






Database: <u>Monitoring situation and development of</u> <u>municipalities</u>

- Contains 184* indicators organized within 15 sectors, with data from 2008 onwards for the Republic of Serbia, all regions, districts <u>and municipalities</u>.
- Sectors with <u>child related indicators</u> are: Social Care (17 indicators), Education (15 indicators), Demography (7 indicators), Health (5 indicators) and Indexes (2 indicators).
- The database is updated four times a year (end of January, April, August and October) and set up on the SORS web site (online access and download).



Total number of social protection beneficiaries registered at the Centre for Social Work, 2021



Data and statistics for children — challenges

- Difficulties with administrative data (some data is missing, poor dissagregation in some cases, data delivery problems).
- Scattering of data in various institutions.
- The national focal point for child statistics (needed precise mandate, one country database?).



Possible improvement

- Easier access to child data produced by responsible NSS institutions.
- To strength the future investment in child data from surveys and administrative sources (production and dissemination).
- New valuable source of data Census 2022 in the Republic of Serbia.
