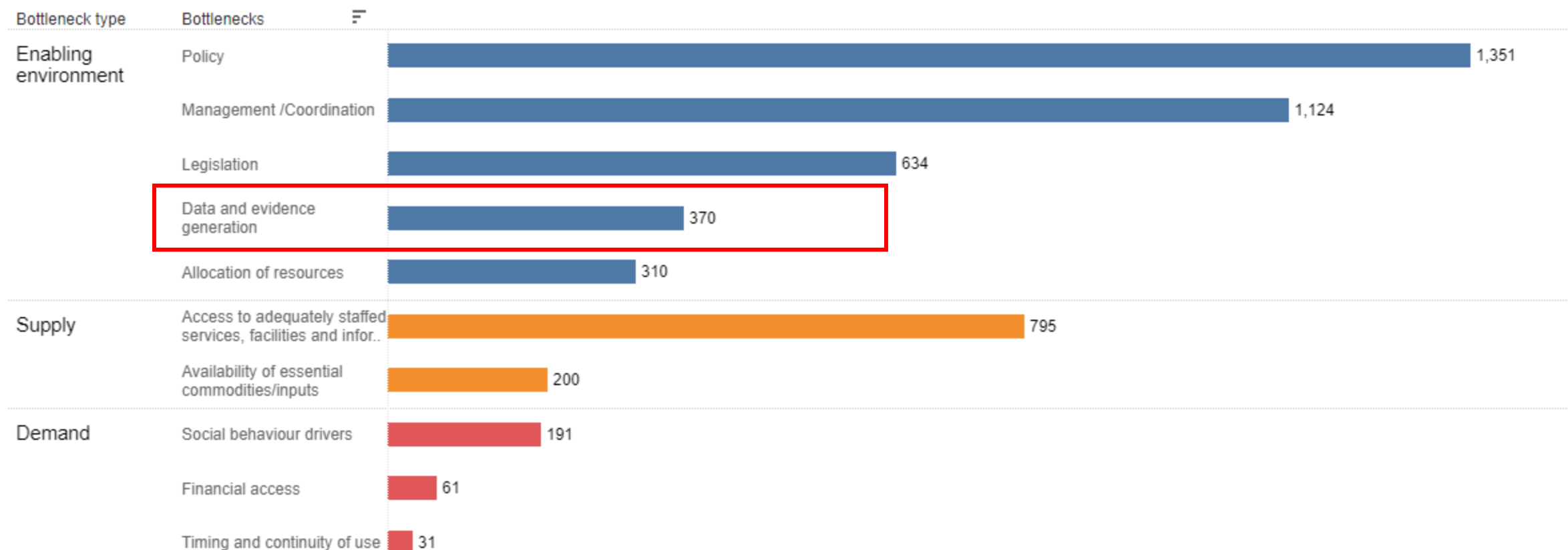

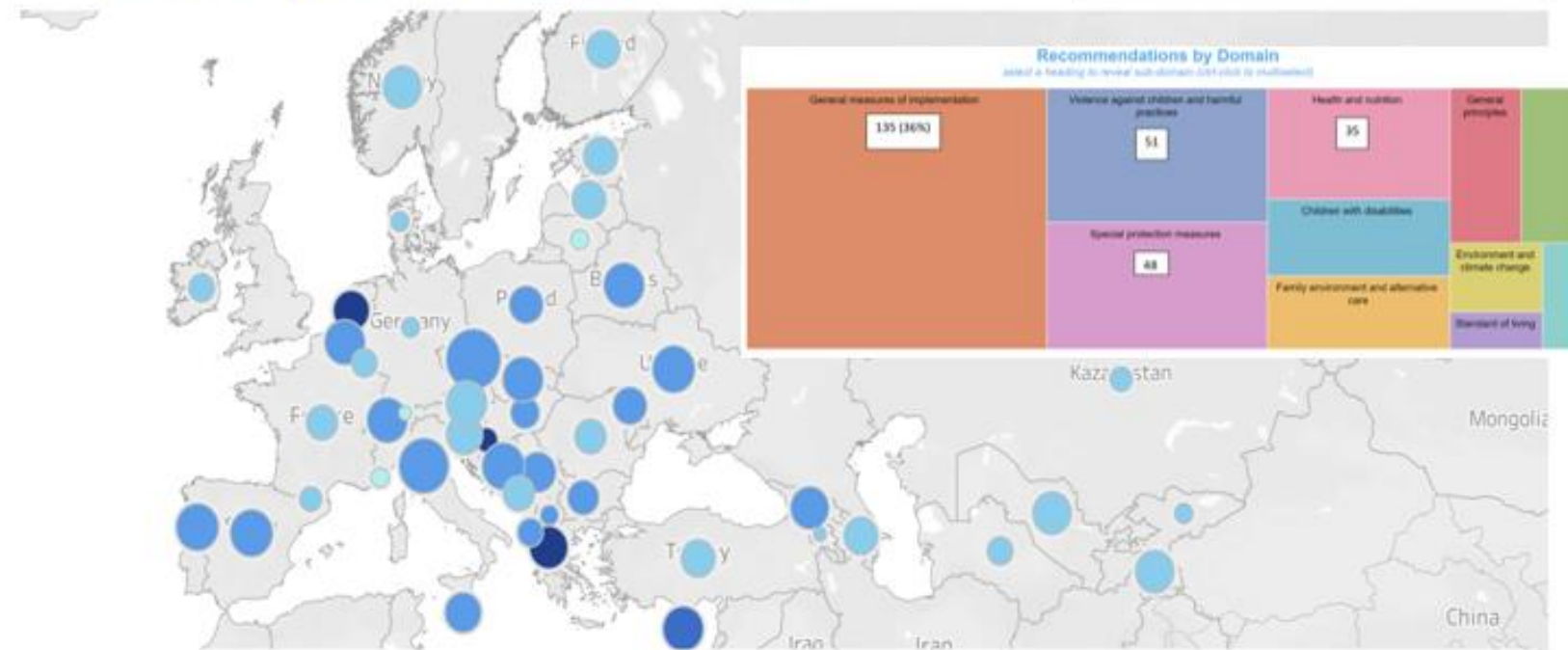

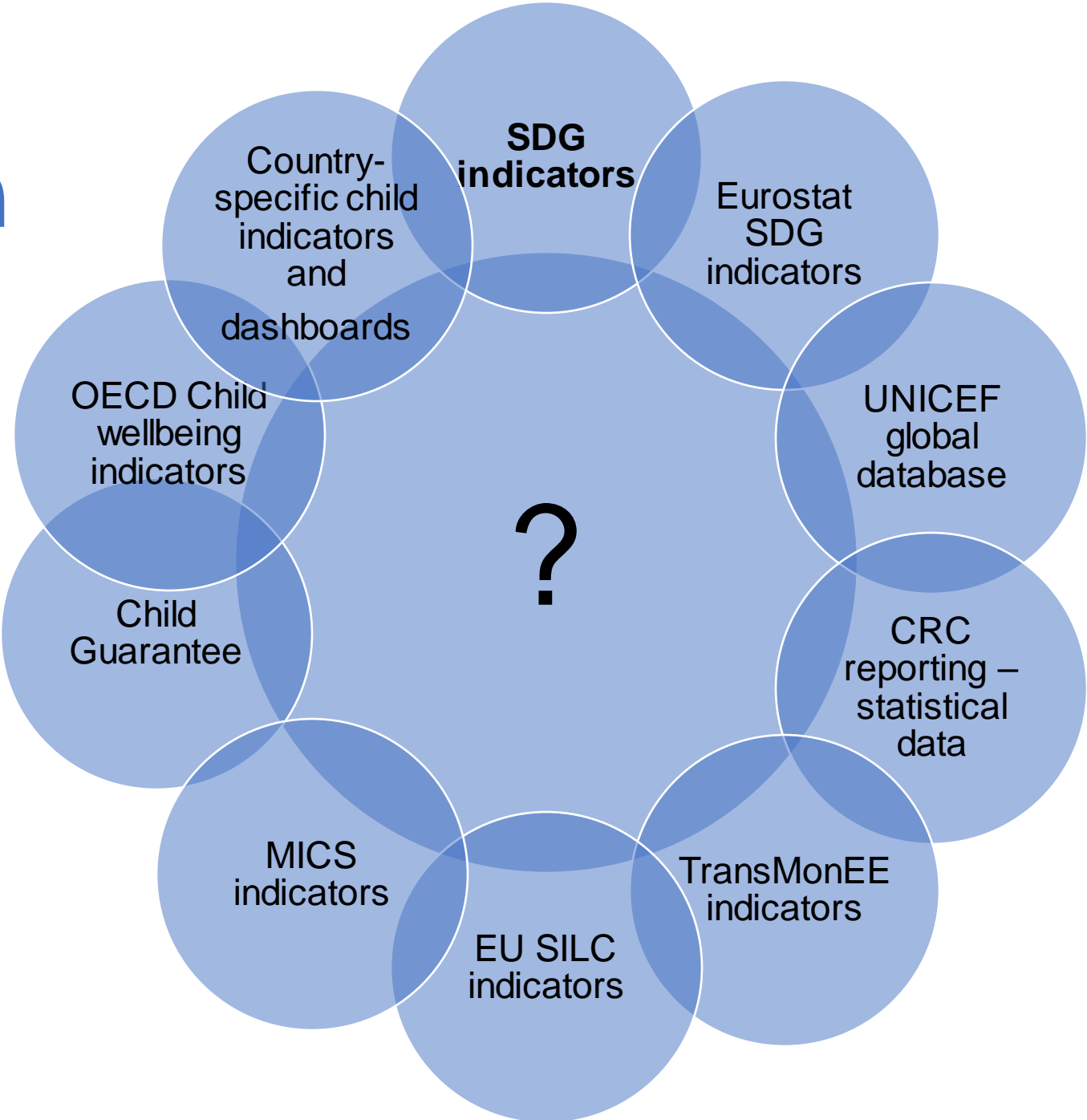

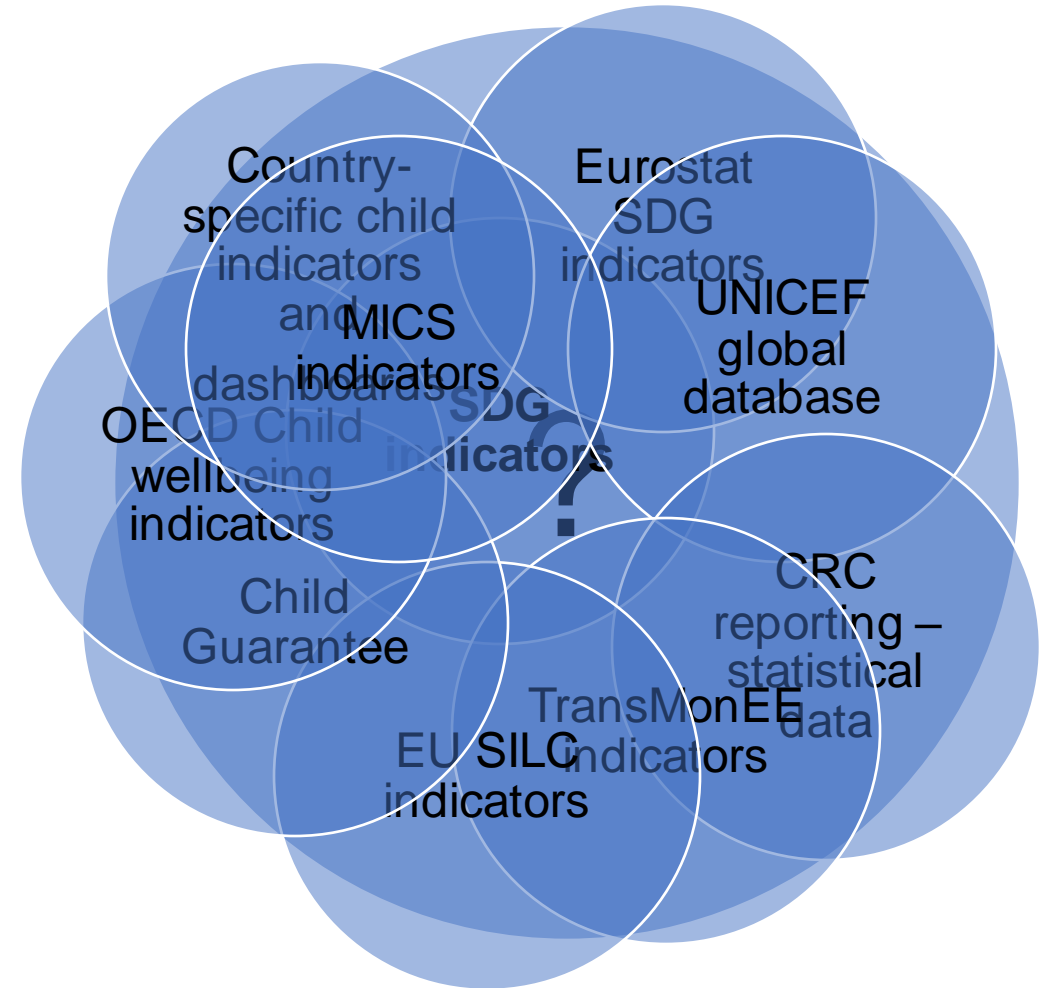

<p>Family environment and Protection spans several interrelated themes. Children in alternative care includes aspects relevant to family preservation, adoption and the alternative care system. ECA CRM Framework – indicator mapping



- Very **initial exercise** to select/identify the core, prioritizing child-related SDG indicators.
- **Ambitious** and **challenging**, but useful...
- **Diverse situation** across sub-domains and rights...some sub-domains without measurement.
- Many **dimensions** to consider - source, representativeness, frequency, comparability, quality and disaggregation.
- **Relevance:** Do we do what we measure? Do we measure what is important for children?
- It will be evolving...
