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FOREWORD

"Children and Youth in Georgia" is a statistical publication prepared by the National Statistics Office of Georgia (Geostat) with the financial and technical support of the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) and mainly includes data for 2015-2019 on the demographic situation, living standards, employment, education, healthcare, violations, tourism, information technology and other important indicators of the population under 25. It also presents the results of the 2014 population census by relevant age groups as well as the results of the Multiple Indicator Cluster Survey – MICS Georgia 2018, conducted by Geostat in 2018-2019 in close cooperation with the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) and the National Center for Disease Control and Public Health (NCDC).

The data presented in the publication are based on the results of surveys conducted by Geostat and on the administrative sources.

The present publication is intended for different groups of users and aims to raise awareness of the public interested in youth issues and assist them in the decision-making process.

Recommendations and suggestions on the format and content of the publication will be appreciated by the group of authors.

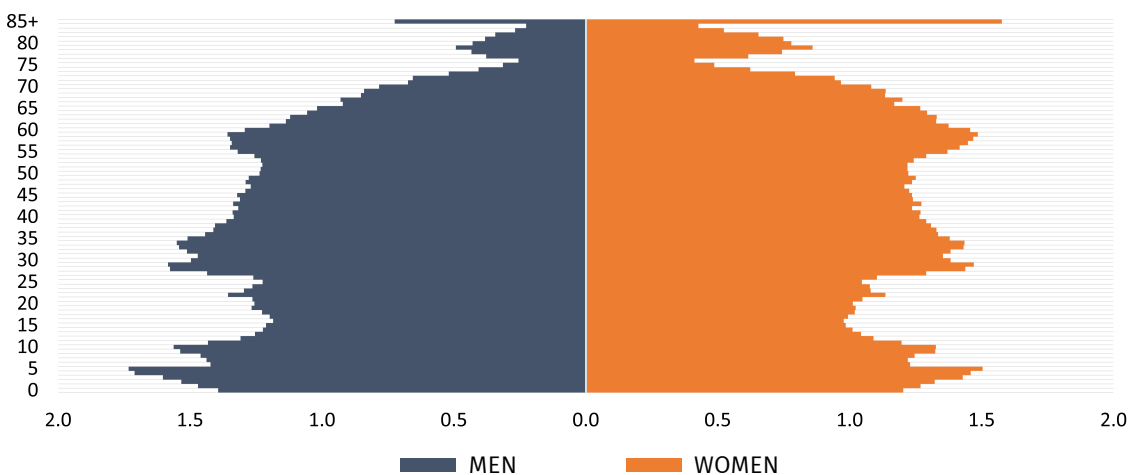

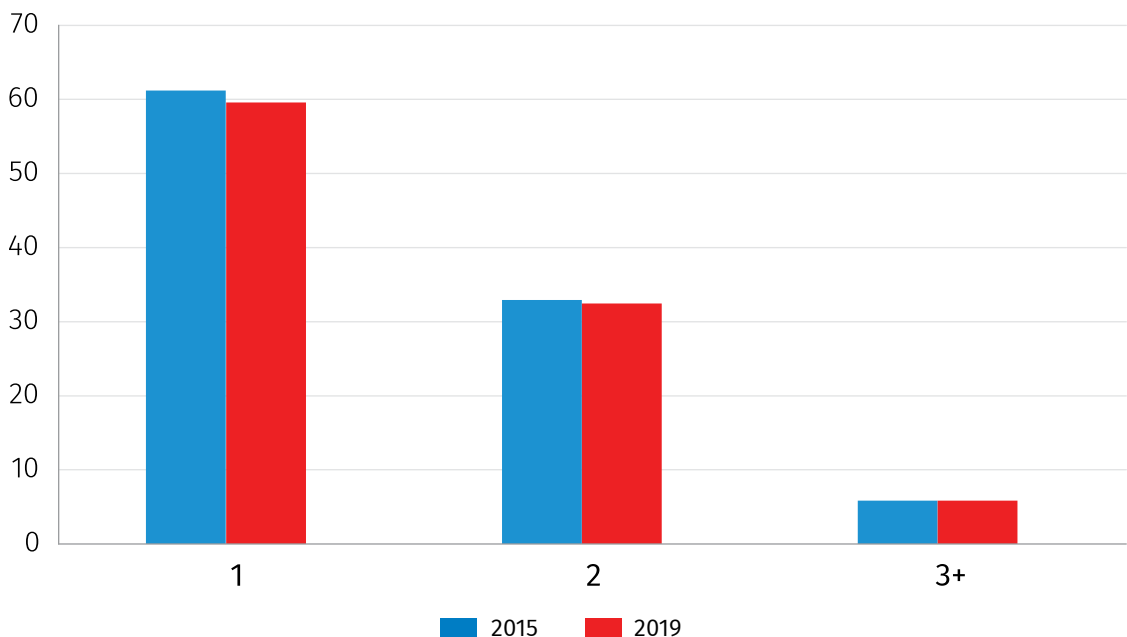

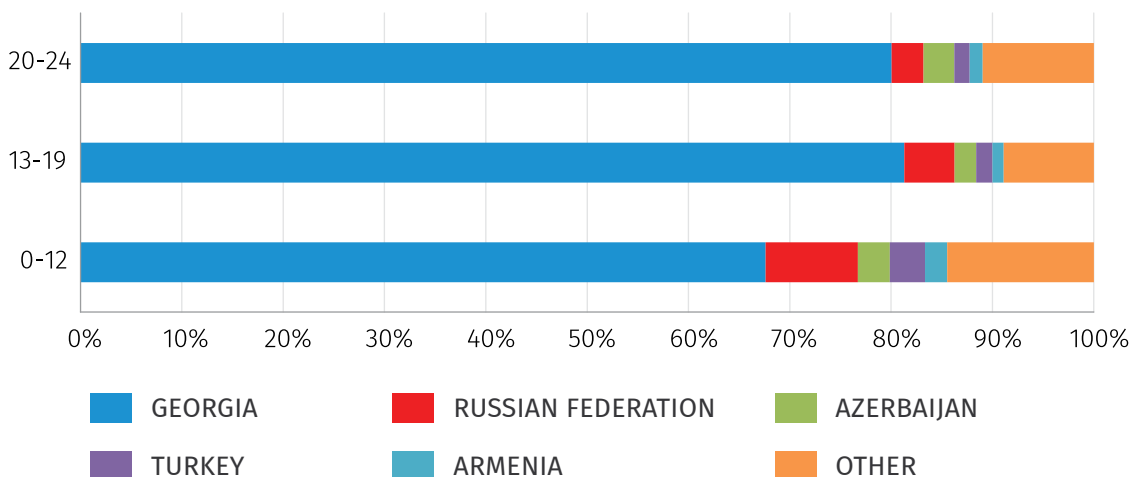

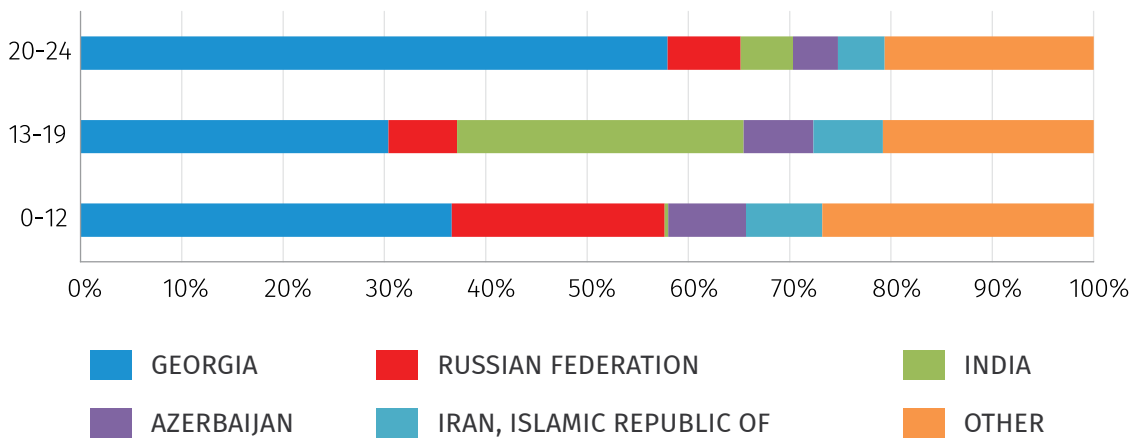

TERMS AND DEFINITIONS

Abortion – artificial termination of a pregnancy which is performed a) deliberately up to 12 months of pregnancy (based on woman's request); b) In accordance with medical and social indications, from 12 to 22 weeks of pregnancy.

Age - number of completed years based on date of birth, i.e. the age reached at the end of the reference year.

Age-specific fertility rate – number of births to women in a particular age group, divided by the number of women in that age group. It is expressed as average number of live births per 1 000 women in a specific age group.

Arrival (travel) - the crossing of the Georgian border by a non-resident traveller of Georgia for any purpose and any duration.

Bachelor's Programme – the educational programme of the first level of higher academic education, where the basics of corresponding specialities are taught in order to enable a person to work with the qualification acquired as a result of these studies and to continue studies for the Master's Programme.

Base year - the year with which the values from other years are compared.

Basic General Education (lower secondary) - level II of the International Standard Classification of Education - Second stage of basic education or first stage of secondary education. Provides the required minimum knowledge acquisition and includes grades VII-IX. Primary and basic education is compulsory.

Child dependency ratio - ratio of population aged 0-14 per 100 population 15-64.

Class – a group of pupils of a general education institution who meet on a temporary basis for at least one academic year in accordance with the recommendations of the National Curriculum and the statute of the educational institution, and study the general educational programmes of any of the levels of general education mainly together.

Computer users – Individuals who used computer (desktop, portable computer (laptop, notebook, netbook), tablet) independently at any place (at home, at work or at other places) at least once in a reference period.

Conditional sentences – sentence imposed on the convicted person under the judgment, which is not enforced in penitentiary institutions.

Convicts - persons against whom a court has passed a judgement of conviction.

The criminal prosecution is the state's legal response to a person who has committed a crime. Under current law, the initiation of a criminal prosecution is the sole discretion of the prosecutor. The criminal prosecution begins in two cases: upon the arrest of a person or upon his / her recognition as the accused. In order to recognize a person as the accused, a prosecutor's decree must be based on a body of evidence. The person against whom the criminal prosecution is carried out has the status of an accused.

Deaths - a termination of all vital functions without a possibility to be recovered.

Divorce - the fact of legal significance which is one of the grounds for termination of marriage between spouses, and is confirmed by the relevant individual administrative-legal act.

Doctoral Programme – the third level educational programme of a higher academic education, a

combination of educational, scientific research components for the training of scientific personnel, which is completed by the granting of a Doctor's academic degree

Emigrants - a person, recorded when crossing the National border, who left the country and has cumulated a minimum of 183 days of residence outside the country during the twelve following months, and who was usual resident of the country when leaving the country, which means that he spent at least a cumulate duration of 183 days of residence inside the country during the twelve months before leaving the country.

Employed – a person who during the reference period (7 days preceding the interview) worked for at least one hour for pay or profit or was temporary absent from the job due to holiday, illness, maternity leave, technical, economic or other similar reasons.

Employment rate – expresses the number of persons who are employed as a percent of the relevant aged population.

A fine is a monetary penalty, the amount of which is determined by the court according to the gravity of the crime committed and the material status of the convicted person.

The First Stage of Higher Education – V-VII levels of education defined by the International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED) - programmes designed to provide intermediate and advanced academic and/or professional knowledge after the secondary education (professional programs, bachelor programs and master programs).

General education – education with the aim of educating and training the citizens of Georgia for professional and public life following general education. A complete general education in Georgia comprises 12 years of schooling.

Graduate - academic degree owner that is awarded to a person as the results of completing the credits established for the higher academic education level.

House arrest - imposition on a convicted person of the obligation to stay in his/her place of residence during a specific period of a day.

Household – a person or group of persons who observe the rules of common living and occupy a single dwelling and are connected by the shared budget (or a part thereof), and by relative or non-relative relationships (a household may consist of one person).

Illness - deterioration of health over a period of time.

Internet users – Individuals who used internet independently at any place (at home, at work or at other places) at least once in a reference period via any device (mobile phone or smartphone, computer, etc.).

Immigrants - a person, recorded when crossing the National border, who entered the country and has cumulated a minimum of 183 days of residence in the country during the twelve following months, and who was not usual resident of the country when entering the country, which means that he spent at least a cumulate duration of 183 days of residence outside the country during the twelve months before entering the country.

Juvenile convicts – persons who have not turned 18 years of age at the time of the crime.

labour force (Economically active population) – is defined as the sum of employed and unemployed persons.

Population outside labour force – a person who during the reference period (7 days preceding the interview) was not employed and within the previous four weeks did not actively search for work and/or was not ready to start working within the next two weeks.

Labour force participation rate (Activity rate) – expresses the labour force as a percent of the relevant aged population.

Larceny - an apparent theft of someone else's property

Live birth - complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of conception, irrespective of the duration of the pregnancy, which after such separation breathes or shows any other evidence of life – e.g., beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord or definite movement of voluntary muscles – whether or not the umbilical cord has been cut or the placenta is attached. Each product of such a birth is considered to be live-born.

Marriage - a voluntary union of a woman and a man for the purpose of creating a family, registered in the territorial offices of the Public Service Development Agency, a legal entity of public law governing the Ministry of Justice of Georgia.

Master's Programme – the second level educational programme of higher academic education that includes the scientific research components and is intended to train specialists of the academic level that follows Bachelor's studies or to train scholars; the programme is also intended to train individuals to work with acquired qualifications.

Multiple Indicator Cluster Survey (MICS) - MICS Georgia was carried out in 2018-2019 by National Statistics Office of Georgia in collaboration with United Nations Children`s Fund (UNICEF) and National Center for disease Control and Public Health (NCDC), as part of the Global MICS Programme in order to obtain and analyze high quality data on the situation of children and women in Georgia. MICS surveys measure key indicators that allow countries to generate data for use in policies, programmes, and national development plans, and to monitor progress towards the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and other internationally agreed upon commitments. The objective of 2018 Georgia MICS was to generate data for the critical assessment of the progress made in various areas, and to identify areas that require more attention.

Mobile Phone Owners – Individuals who owned mobile phone and/or smartphone in a reference period.

Mobile Phone Users – Individuals who used mobile phone and/or smartphone independently at any place (at home, at work or at other places) at least once in a reference period.

Personal (Desktop) Computer – a personal computer designed for regular use at a single location and cannot be easily moved from one place to another due to its size and power requirements. Typically, a stationary computer consists of a processor, a monitor and other auxiliary devices.

Pension (old age) – is a monthly state disbursement to a certain category of the citizens permanently residing on the territory of Georgia, as well as the citizens of foreign states that have been legally residing

on the territory of Georgia for the past 10 years and the persons without citizenship, disbursed on the basis of reaching the retirement age, in order to provide them with minimum subsistence means.

Population - the total number of usual residents in a given area at a given time. The number of population is calculated as of 1 January considering natural increase and net-migration.

Portable computer (laptop, notebook, netbook) – a computer that is small enough to carry and usually enables the same tasks as a desktop computer. Portable computer is an important device for access to the Internet remotely using both - wired and mobile or wireless connections.

Primary General Education – I level at International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED) – the first stage of basic education. This level provides with education on basic elements and typically lasts six years.

Pupil – a person enrolled in a general education institution as provided for by the legislation of Georgia

Robbery - explicit seizure of another person's movable property for its unlawful appropriation.

Sex ratio by age groups - the ratio of males to females by different age groups.

Smartphone – mobile phone with multifunctional abilities and advanced functionalities (for example, a more sophisticated touch screen, internet connection, etc.).

Social package – is a monthly state disbursement to a certain category of the citizens of Georgia in the presence of relevant grounds defined by law.

Subsistence Allowance – targeted social assistance that is a pecuniary disbursement with the goal to improve the social-economic state of the extremely vulnerable families identified under the assessment system,

Statistics on domestic violence - are recorded in accordance with the issued restraining orders.

Stillborn - a fetus, whose death is prior to the complete expulsion or extraction from its mother, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy; the fetus does not breathe or show any other signs of life, such as beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord, or contraction of certain groups of skeletal muscles.

Tablet – a computer that is integrated into a flat touch screen. Tablets have touchscreen display, operating system and battery in a single, thin and flat package. Operation of such a device is mainly by touch (finger or stylus) and not by any physical device (such as a keyboard). However, keyboards and similar devices can also be used by connecting them to a tablet computer.

Theft - hidden theft of someone else's property.

Traveller – a person who moves between different geographic locations, for any purpose and any duration.

Unemployed – a person who during the reference period (7 days preceding the interview), was not employed and within the previous four weeks actively searched for work and in case of success was ready to start work within the next two weeks.

Unemployment rate – expresses the number of unemployed as a percent of the labour force.

Usual place of residence – the settlement, house, apartment, where the interviewee spends most of the time. Such a place may or may not coincide with the place of registration.

Vocational education system - the institutions implementing the vocational education program in Georgia are: a) Vocational college - a vocational education institution that implements only the first three levels of vocational education programs; B) Community College - a vocational education institution that implements vocational education programs at all levels, as well as preparatory general education, Georgian language and liberal education programs; C) General education institution - is authorized to implement educational programs of the first three levels of vocational education; D) Higher education institution - is authorized to implement vocational education programs at all levels.

Victim - The victim may be a natural or legal person or the state, who has suffered moral, physical or property damage as a result of the crime and in respect of whom the prosecutor has issued the victim recognition decree.

Victim of domestic violence – a family member whose constitutional rights and freedoms have been violated through neglecting and/or physical, psychological, sexual, economic forms of violence and/or coercion.

Visit - is a movement of visitors.

Visitor - is a traveller aged 15 or above, resident of Georgia who took a trip outside his/her usual environment within Georgia for less than a year except for employment purposes and frequent (once every two weeks or more often) visits.
